Risk of fire and explosion and of being struck by other</p>	<p>Passengers, other road users and pedestrians.</p>	<p>Vehicles maintained in accordance with DVSA requirements. Daily vehicle inspection carried out in accordance with driver's handbook, with a defect reporting procedure in place</p> <p>Competent drivers. Seatbelts fitted in accordance with legal requirements. Passengers briefed to remain seated at all times.</p> <p>Driver pulls as far off road as possible. Passengers alight to a safe place away from the vehicle.</p> <p>Keys removed from ignition whenever minibus is parked. Driver conducts vehicle inspection prior to commencement of journey.</p> <p>Passengers are to remain seated in the vehicle while fuelling is in progress. No smoking while refuelling is in progress Drivers wear appropriate footwear</p> <p>Emergency and breakdown procedures detailed in driver's logbook on the minibus. Passengers to be removed to a place of safety. Hazard warning lights and warning triangle. Minibus team to notify event control as soon as possible Reliable emergency contact number. Drivers have basic first response training and First aid kit up to date and well stocked on the minibus. Driver has means of communication with emergency services, event control and breakdown company.</p>

<u>PERSONAL RISK FACTORS</u> Young persons – lack of safety awareness Risk of injury due to lack of awareness of existing or potential hazards, horseplay etc. Passengers personal safety at stops Risk of injury and abduction	Passengers, other road users and pedestrians.	Driver or other volunteer gives safety announcement where needed Record of passengers to be kept and handed to Checkpoint manager at end of event Frequent and extended rest periods and driving breaks. Another competent person to drive the vehicle should be available should illness occur. Another Leader or other nominated person seated on minibus to supervise passengers.	
<u>BIOLOGICAL HAZARDS</u> Body fluids Risk of contamination and subsequent illness following direct contact with bodily fluids or viruses	Passengers	Cleaning materials kept on board which MUST include anti bacterial sprays, cloths etc. Disposal bags which must be able to be tied to prevent spillage. If you are in any doubt, please seek advice before the journey.	
<u>ACCESS AND EGRESS</u> Obstructions in gangways / emergency exits Liquid spills or rainwater Minibus access steps Risk of falling while boarding	Passengers	Driver checks to ensure luggage is correctly stowed before moving off. Safety briefing before moving off. Passengers briefed not to move around vehicle at all whilst in motion. Cleaning materials made available Well maintained vehicle floor surfaces, step nosings etc. Handrails.

Information provided to other leaders and passengers. Competent drivers to be used at all times Route planning to avoid known problem areas where possible Driver awareness of hazardous terrain.</p>
